
Rejoice and be glad! Blessed are you, holy are you! Rejoice and be glad! Yours is the kingdom of God!

After programming this anthem, we learned that many women have recently come forward with allegations of sexual misconduct by the composer, David Haas (New York Times, Aug. 10, 2020). We also understand that Haas has since published an apology on his own website. The Catholic Church has decided to boycott Haas's music, which is certainly an understandable response. We're responding to the news in a different way. We'll sing "Blest Are They," because it's beautiful and its text really is perfect for today's sermon. But we're also sharing the news about Haas, as

a way to highlight the fact that sexual abuse is a pervasive phenomenon found in all walks of life, and that it stems, at least in part, from societal forces that it is incumbent upon all of us to change. We are also making donations, equal in amount to what we paid for the scores, to the Maui Sexual Assault Center and the Friends of the Children's Justice Center, and we will inform David Haas of these actions.
