

Come in, come in and sit down, you are a part of the family. We are lost and we are found, and we are a part of the family There's life to be shared in the bread and the wine;



Mark 12:38-44 (New Revised Standard Version)

As Jesus taught, he said, "Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets! They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation." He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. Christ's table is open to all. We ask you to hold your elements so that we all might partake of the bread and cup together.

Words of Invitation

One: Beloved in Christ, the Gospel tells us that on the first day of the week Jesus Christ was raised from death, appeared to Mary Magdalene, on that same day sat at the table with two disciples, and was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

Many: This is the joyful feast of the people of God. Men and women, youth and children, come from the east and the west, from the north and south and gather about Christ's table

One: All who wish to know the presence of Christ and share in the community of God's people are welcome at this table.

One: God be with you.

Many: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

Many: We lift them up to our God.

One: Let us give thanks to God Most High.

Many: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Words of Institution

Many: Holy, holy, holy, My heart, my heart adores You. My heart knows how to say to You, Holy are you God!

Blessing of the Bread and the Cup

(John's words. Let us all join in, to praying what Jesus taught His disciples:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth, as it is in heaven. Given us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and gory, forever and ever. Amen
