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LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLE

Reader 1: On our Advent Journey we have lit three candles: the first candle of **Hope**, the second candle of **Peace** and the third candle of **Love**. By doing so, we are daring to express our longing for peace, for healing, and for the wellbeing of all creation.

Reader 2: Today we light the fourth candle, the candle of **Joy**. In the Advent Season this is usually the easy one. But we are in challenging times and many of our usual cues and expectations are changed. These changes can, at times, push joy to the side. But **Joy** is still there, like an underground spring that wells up within us. It is also a choice, an attitude. Like a muscle, it needs to be exercised. So today we open ourselves to **Joy**, trusting that God has already planted it in us. All we need to do is give it care and offer it to share.

Reader 1: We light the candle of **Joy** to symbolize the Joy that is ours when we stay connected to the Spirit who is always sustaining us for the work of bringing the Light of Christ into the world.

We Continue in Prayer

Loving God, we open ourselves to you this Advent season. As these candles are lit, light our lives with your imagination. Show us the creative power of hope. Teach us the peace that comes from justice. Magnify your love within us. Prepare our hearts to be transformed by you that we may always walk in the light of Christ. Join us now as we offer this prayer, saying...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.

for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.”

³⁴ Mary said to the angel, “How can this be, since I am a virgin?” ³⁵ The angel said to her, “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶ And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God.” ³⁸ Then Mary said, “Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.” Then the angel departed from her.
