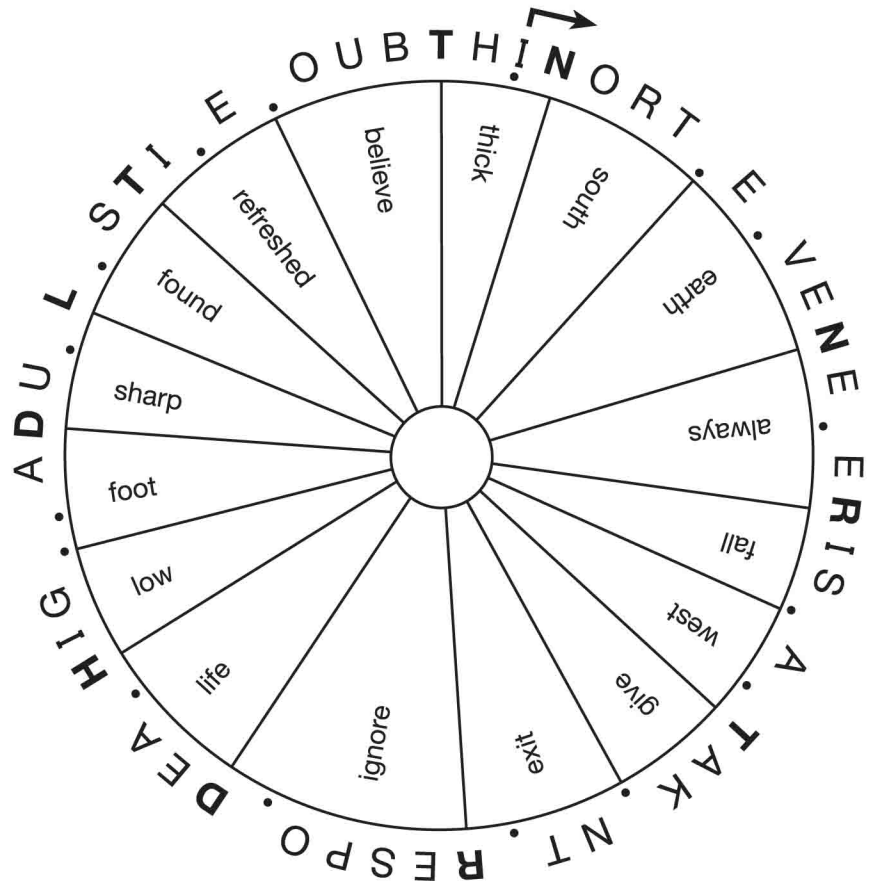


Can you imagine how amazed and excited Mary must have felt?

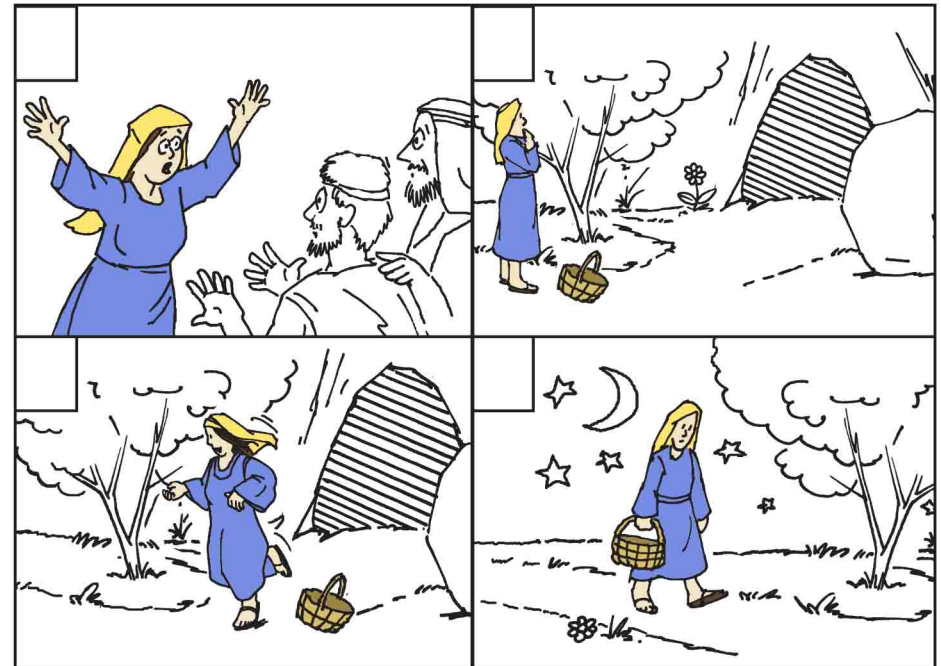
